My dear Friends

This weekend we celebrate the fifth Sunday of Lent. I often think that this week is a preparation for Holy Week and certainly the Gospel for this Sunday points us in that direction.

Many people from all over have come to the Temple in Jerusalem for the festival to praise and worship God. Jesus and his disciples are also there in that huge crowd. Some Greeks speak to Philip, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.'

We do not know why they ask this. Perhaps they have heard about Jesus, heard about his miracles, his teaching. Are they simply curious? Do they want to become his disciples? We do not know.

But it is in this context that we need to listen to the reply of Jesus to his disciples. He speaks about his death and the fruit that it will bear. 'Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you, most solemnly, unless a what grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest.'

He is also very clear on what it will take to become a disciple. 'Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too...'

In other words, we must let go of our ideas and our plans and place ourselves in the hands of God and allow him to take hold of us and lead us and guide us. We can only understand this in the light of the death of Jesus. Because this is the road he took. He is the grain of wheat which falls into the ground and dies. The seed buried in the cold, damp darkness of earth breaks apart, disintegrates and from this disintegration comes new life. Jesus surrendered completely to the Father's love by obediently laying down his human life for us. Jesus will undergo intense suffering, physical disintegration, death and burial so as to bring forth the new life of the resurrection.

In our lives we die many many 'little' deaths-the loss of loved ones, relationships breaking down, loss of our jobs, the loss of our health, lost opportunities. These are very painful to live through- but if like Jesus we surrender ourselves completely into the Father's love we will be able to face these deaths, holding on to the hand of Jesus, knowing that he understands our pain and distress and knowing that he too underwent suffering and death. These little deaths prepare us for our final death, when as Jesus did, we will place everything into the Father's hands and walk into our eternal life, where we will be at last enfolded in that wonderful love forever.

Dear friends, please do stay safe and well. Be assured of my thoughts and prayers as we spend this week preparing ourselves to celebrate the most sacred week of the year-Holy Week. May God bless you all.
