My dear parishioners

Sunday is the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel comes from Matthew 16: 21-

27. In fact, this gospel is a continuation of last week's gospel. If you remember, in last

Sunday's gospel Peter recognised Jesus as the Christ and he was called the Rock- upon

which the church would be built.

But immediately after this 'high point' Peter shows his limitations. Jesus makes it clear

that he is going to Jerusalem, where he will suffer grievously, be put to death and be

raised up on the third day. Peter has not really understood who Jesus really is, because

he cannot accept that the outcome of Jesus ministry will be suffering and death. He

rejects that completely. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord. This must not happen to you.'

No doubt that he is hoping for a political Messiah, one who would free the Jews from

the oppression of Rome. However, Jesus is a very different Messiah. And his teachings

of love and forgiveness will lead him on a very different path- a path leading to suffering

and death. Jesus does not run away from his mission- in fact he speaks very harshly to

Peter, calling him Satan.

Jesus calls each one of us to follow him- and to follow him on the way to the cross by

carrying our own cross. Following Jesus will not lead us away from difficulties,

challenges, pain and suffering. Following Jesus, taking up our cross, means accepting

and living with all the difficulties, pain and suffering that we have to face- all the

challenges and sorrows of life.

When Jesus walked the road to Calvary, help was there to encourage him to the end. His mother gave him her loving and supportive presence, Veronica wiped the blood and sweat from his face and Simon shared the weight of the cross. We cannot go through life without help- we need it. And it will come, often from unexpected places- but come it will. Perhaps we too might ask ourselves this week- Who needs my help to walk on their journey? Who needs a phone call, a helping hand, words of reassurance?

What we do need to understand is that everything, absolutely everything can draw us into an ever-closer relationship with Jesus. There are no circumstances in which the living presence of Jesus cannot guide us and give us the strength to move ahead each day. Nothing can separate us from his love and his friendship. So let us not be afraid to take up our cross and follow him. Be sure that he will strengthen us, support us, encourage us and send us help on the way.

I end this week's reflection with these beautiful words of Pope Francis: "Jesus, with his cross, walks with us and takes upon himself our fears, our problems, and our sufferings, even those which are deepest and most painful. The cross of Christ bears the suffering and the sin of humankind, including our own. Jesus accepts all of this with open arms, bearing on His shoulders our crosses and saying to us: 'Have courage! You do not carry your cross alone! I carry it with you. I have overcome death and I have come to give you hope, to give you life."
